

OUR RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

Nobody could have predicted the challenges that would face us all this year with the COVID-19 pandemic. The restrictions in place around funerals and social distancing impacted bereaved parents profoundly, causing them to feel further isolated with their grief and loss, not knowing where to turn. Anam Cara had to respond quickly to the needs of these parents where the traditional supports and comforts would not be available to them.

Anam Cara developed and produced 8 online Bereavement Support video vignettes to help bereaved parents at this very difficult time. The clips complement the Anam Cara videos and information Pack already available on anamcara.ie



Anam Cara also needed to find a way to support the parents who were already engaged with our services as all face-to-face meetings and events had to be cancelled. After a process of implementing technical and online group facilitation training, we launched our online group supports for parents in May 2020. We now have 8 online groups operating monthly serving parents who usually attend the face-to-face monthly meetings at all 12 of our locations.

In line with all other live events, our Annual Training and Review workshop was also cancelled and it too was brought online. This was a very successful event with all of our Professional Facilitators and many of our Volunteer Parents taking part and upskilling so that they are prepared for the needs of parents and the issues that the pandemic and lockdown will have raised for them as we hopefully get back to face-to-face groups in the Autumn.


Brid McGettigan is our very empathetic professional facilitator and I volunteer, with one other bereaved parent, as parent facilitators.

INTRODUCING OUR NEW BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT EVENINGS

Our annual Parent Survey in 2019 showed that some parents who attended our Bereavement Information Evenings felt that they needed more information and support than was available at these events. Some wanted to be with parents who had suffered a similar loss to them, particularly those whose child had died close to birth or those who had lost a child through suicide.

In response, we collaborated with Pieta and Féileacáin to host Bereavement Support Evenings, where all three organisations were available at the event to provide information and support to all of the parents who attended.

We piloted two events in September 2019, one in Dublin and one in Cork. We also ran one in February 2020 as part of our planned services for 2020. Feedback was very positive and we hope to make these events a part of our regular bi-annual information evening schedule bringing them to more locations nationwide in the Autumn.
